I look forward to updating you again in the weeks ahead.











Trish Miles and myself are covering the following subjects this term-Literacy, Numeracy, Scientific Studies, Physical Education, Society and Culture and Language and Other Cultures. Over the past couple of weeks, we have been setting up for success by allowing the students to assemble their own SACE folders with a focus on Preference Based Learning, (a combination of short, highly preferred activities and instructional tasks). As you are aware, the students have been swimming for the past couple of weeks and they have also learnt some Italian in Language and Other Cultures such as, 'Ciao!'- Hello, 'Come Stai?'-How are you? 'Sto bene grazie'-I am well thanks. The students have been very brave speaking another language and are enjoying it.
